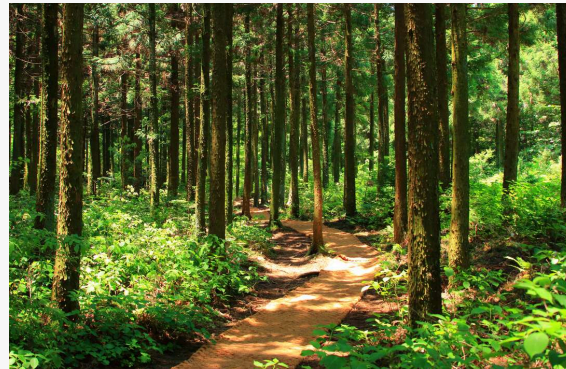

Collaborative Partners:

- Concord: early leader leveraging the value of First Nation partners.
- Canada Infrastructure Bank (CIB): bridging financing gaps with economical, win-win solutions.

The Ownership Model:

- Partnership between Alexander FN & FNpower 50/50 forming Alexander FN Power LP
- Alexander FN Power LP partnered with Concord Green Energy to own 51% of Tilley Project.

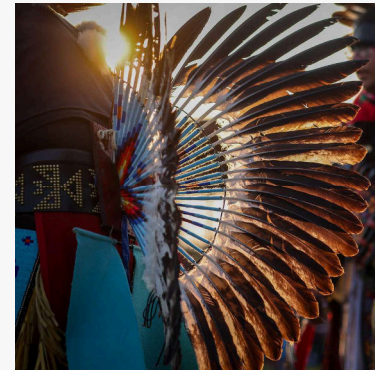
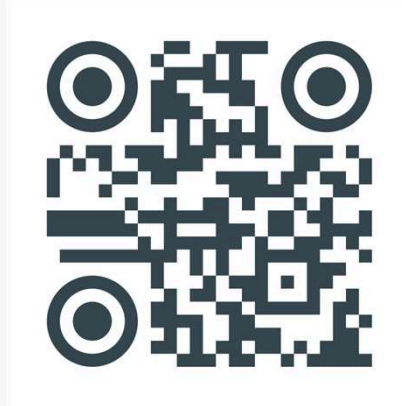
