

# Defining Green PSD: Donors' green and economic ambitions can be broken down into five overarching objectives

These are related to both climate change and the environment more broadly...

1.Climate change mitigation

2. Adaptation and/or increased resilience to climate change

3. Reducing adverse or enhancing positive environmental effects

4. Adaptation to and/or increased resilience to environmental risks

5. Creation of more inclusive and green economic opportunities

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#### What we want to achieve in this session

Yesterday's session on Greening MSD in agriculture yesterday introduced the idea of a spectrum of programme approaches...

Do no harm

Some environmental/ climate-related objectives Equal prioritization of economic and environmental/climate-related objectives

...with donors increasingly expecting programmes to be intentional about positive green results

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3. Retro-fitting programs with green objectives is doable but challenging – strategic 'green' design is likely to increase effectiveness.



4. Large-scale ambitions in green PSD are not always matched by opportunities on the ground.
